BIPOC publishing amplifies voices from historically marginalized Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities and seeks to create a more equitable and diverse literary landscape. There are challenges BIPOC publishers and authors must overcome – resistance to BIPOC publishing reflects deeper systemic issues within society at large. Niche market stereotyping, resistance to stories that challenge prevailing narratives, and limited resources for BIPOC publishers and authors that restrict their reach and impact. Will publishers nurture and embrace our growing diversity, or relegate BIPOC to niche market purgatory?
